TCU - January 13-14, 2018
UTEP - January 13-14, 2018
ARPC - January 27-28, 2018
Austin County 4-H - January 13-14, 2018

CITIES/STATE LOCATION:

Ft Worth, El Paso, Amarillo, and Victoria Texas

ELIGIBILITY:

This competition is open to all competitors born in 1998 or later. All competitors must be individual members of USA Shooting. In order to be eligible for USAS awards, all competitors in a State JO match must have residency within that state. TSRA membership is also required.

RESIDENCE:

Each competitor may claim residence in only one state and must declare the state of residence on the entry form. Residents are eligible for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place USA Shooting State Championship medallions. Non-Residents may compete for invitations to the National Championship and are encouraged to do so. Non-residents are not eligible for state awards. **All competitors are eligible for state TSRA awards.**

Residency is defined as to where the competitor holds a current and valid driver's license. If the competitor does not have a driver's license, residency is then defined as the residence of the competitor's parents/guardians. Only U.S. Citizens are eligible for medals at both the state JOSOC and NJOSOC. Foreign competitors may compete in a State JO but they will not be eligible for the NJOSOC

ENTRY:

Only scores from a registered State Junior Olympic match will count for invitation to the National Junior Olympic Championships. Shooters may not compete in more than one state JOSOC. Juniors who fire in their own home state JOSOC will not be allowed to shoot in another state. Juniors from states which are not holding a state JOSOC, and those who cannot attend their own state JOSOC, will be allowed to enter as a non-resident in another state. Non-residents should declare their home state at entry and are not eligible for USA Shooting state resident awards.

CATEGORIES:

The following categories will be used for the individual competition:
(Based on the age the competitor will be in the year 2018)

Junior (J1); age 18-20; competitors born from 1998-2000.

Intermediate Junior (J2); age 15-17; competitors born from 2001-2003.

Sub-Junior (J3); age 14 & under; competitors born 2004 or later

CLASSIFICATION:

Male / Female

RULES:

The current edition of USA Shooting Rules will govern.

COURSES OF FIRE:

Air Rifle (10m) – Women; 40 shots, all standing.

Men: 60 shots, all standing.

Smallbore Rifle (50') – 3x20 for all.

No Finals will be conducted for any competition at any location.

TIME LIMITS:

Air rifle – Women: 50 minutes (Electronic Targets)

60 minutes (Paper Targets - Orion)

Men: 1 hour, 15 minutes (Electronic Targets)

1 hour, 30 minutes (Paper Targets - Orion)

Smallbore Rifle – Electronic targets

1 hour, 45 minutes plus one 15 minute preparation/sighting time.

Sighting time is included in the 15 minutes.

Paper Targets (Orion)

2 hours, plus one 15 minute preparation/sighting time.

Sighting time is included in the 15 minutes.

FIREARMS:

Air Rifles – .177 caliber air rifle.

Smallbore Rifle – .22 caliber smallbore rifle.

(See 2014 USA Shooting Rules for specifics on both)

SIGHTS:

Metallic only.

TARGETS:

TCU – MegaLink

UTEP – MegaLink

ARPC – Orion

Victoria - Orion

COACHING:

Coaching on the firing line will not be permitted. Shooter may request coaching, but through the Range Officer only & must leave the firing line to meet with the coach.

SCORING PROTESTS:

A scoring protest is \$1.00 per shot.

TIES:

All ties will be broken in accordance with the USA Shooting Rules.

PARTICIPATION PINS:

One per competitor.

AWARDS:

USA Shooting – 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place medallions (gold, silver, & bronze) for resident winners.

TSRA – 1st, 2nd & 3rd place in each classification and category per event. There must be three shooters in a class for an award. 6 shooters for 2nd place award, and ten shooters for 3rd place award.

MAKING ENTRY:

Initially, contact the match director at the location in which you intend to participate for squadding and pre-registration information. All fees & paperwork must be completed properly before competing. Be sure and arrive early enough to finalize the paperwork & fees prior to your relay time. Current USA Shooting & TSRA membership is required. Please provide the membership numbers on the pre-registration forms which include a USA Shooting & TSRA entry form. If you are shooting both events (air & smallbore rifle) then two USA Shooting entry forms must be submitted, one for each event. Only one TSRA entry form is needed for both events. Use the Contact information above for your location to obtain pre-registration information, schedule your relay and generate a packet for you on match day. Firing positions are assigned on a first come, first serve basis. Payment must be received to reserve your firing position. It is important to contact the match coordinator at the site you wish to compete at for registration information and lane assignments prior to arriving for the match.

RELAY SCHEDULE:

Contact match official at the location you wish to compete for match scheduling. More relays may be added if needed.

MATCH ENTRY FEE:

\$25 per shooter per event

The entry fees do include the USA Shooting sanctioning fee of \$12.00. All fees & paperwork will be completed on match day. There is no pre-registration. The entry fee for the match does not include membership fees! Junior USA Shooting memberships are \$30 (1 year) and TSRA memberships are \$5 (1 year). **Checks should be payable to Guy Taylor, Match Director.**

DIRECTION TO RANGES:**El Paso – UTEP Range**

Located in the Military Science building on Glory Road across from Memorial Gym. From I-10 take the Schuster exit and go left on Sun Bowl Drive. Pass the Sun Bowl and go right on Glory Road. At the

stop sign go left and turn left into the military science building. The range phone number is 915-747-6651.

Ft. Worth – TCU Range

From I-30 take Exit 12 (University Dr.) there will be a sign directing you toward TCU/City Park/Zoo. Continue down University Dr. and it will take you thru the middle of campus. The first street past campus will be Bellaire Dr. N. - turn right; the Education (Bailey) Building will be on one corner and on the opposite corner will be Einstein Bagels. One half block down Bellaire Dr. There will be a parking lot on your right; this is a "Visitor's Parking Lot" and "Tom Brown/Pete Wright Residential" parking lot. The range is located next to this parking lot; it is a one story building next to the west side of the lot. Phone number at the rifle range is 817-257-5258.
