

2021 Texas State Hunter Pistol Silhouette Championships

- Location: Austin Rifle Club Range. Manor, Texas
Host Club: Austin Rifle Club
Dates: Friday May 21 – Open range practice and registration
Saturday May 22 - HP & HPOS
Sunday May 23 – SBHP & SBHPOS
Rules: Current NRA Hunter Pistol Silhouette rules will apply.
Eligibility: This is a TSRA sanctioned State Championship. You **MUST BE** a TSRA member in good standing to compete in this match. You will be required to show either a current membership card or purchase a membership in order to compete. NRA Membership is not required but is encouraged.
Individual Entries: Entries will be limited to 60 competitors for each competition. To assist with the planning of the match, advanced entries are preferred. Advanced entries must be received by May 18th. Full refunds will be made if you are unable to attend. **Late entries will be accepted until 8:00AM the morning of the first match and will be assessed a \$10.00 late entry fee per gun per shooter.**

Schedule: Friday - The range will be open for practice from 12:00 pm to 6:00 pm
Saturday & Sunday – Range open for practice and registration from 7:00am-8:00am. Relay one of the scoped match will be called to the line at 8:45 am. Shootoffs will immediately follow the completion of the match. There will be a 60 minute lunch break; the iron site match will begin after the lunch break.
Safety: Empty chamber indicators will be required. If you do not have a suitable indicator, one will be available for purchase for \$1.00 at registration. All pistols, unless inside a closed carrying case, must display an empty chamber indicator in the action when not in use. All pistols must be carried in a box or case with action opened. Hearing and eye protection will be required on the firing line. Absolutely no handling of firearms while anyone is downrange or forward of the firing line. **Alcoholic beverages will not be permitted on the ranges. Any competitor consuming alcoholic beverages before or during the match will be disqualified from the event.**

Course of fire: Each match will consist of 60 rounds fired as follows:
15 Chicken Targets at 40 Meters
15 Javalina Targets at 50 Meters
15 Turkey Targets at 75 Meters
15 Ram Targets at 100 Meters
Squadding: All matches will be squadded in relays. At least two relays are planned, additional relays will only be added if needed based on entries or shared equipment. Squadding cards may be picked up Friday or up to 30 minutes prior to each match. Please include squadding preferences in your application. Preferred squadding is not guaranteed, but we will make every effort. Squadding preference will go to shooters sharing equipment, families and early entries in that order. Requests for specific targets or relay numbers will be ignored.
Target Setting: Target setting will NOT be provided.
Scoring: All competitors will be scored by a competitor in the following or preceding relay. No competitor may mark his or her own scorecard. Scorecards lacking signatures of scorer and/or competitor, as well as the **firearm serial number**, will be disqualified.
Shoot-offs: All shoot-offs will be at five targets.
Equipment: All equipment will be inspected before being tagged. Only tagged firearms will be allowed in competition.

- Classification: NRA Hunter Pistol Silhouette classification cards will be used. Any competitors without a NRA classification card. Any competitor without a NRA classification card will compete in the master class.
- Special Awards: Will be awarded for High Woman, High Senior and High Junior. Entrants may enter in only one of the special award categories in any given match (4). Entries for special awards must be entered BEFORE the first shot in the applicable match is fired. An entrant may compete for a senior award if he/she will have celebrated their 60th birthday before January 1st 2022. Participants may compete as a Junior through December 31st of the calendar year in which their 20th birthday occurs.
- Awards: The following individual awards will be given in each championship: State Champion. 1st place in each class and one additional place for each 5 competitors. A minimum of three competitors will make a class; classes with fewer than three entries will be combined with the next higher class. Fewer than three Master class shooters will compete for overall awards only. All awards will be a trophy.
- Aggregate Awards: A four gun aggregate award will be presented to the Texas Hunter's Pistol Silhouette State Champion and Reserve Champion. Two gun aggregate awards to the Texas Hunter's Pistol Silhouette Scoped-gun State Champion and Texas Hunter's Pistol Silhouette Metallic Sight State Champion. The two-gun aggregate awards will combine small-bore and hunter pistol scores from the scoped and metallic sight matches, respectively.
- Governors 20: Governors 20 pins will be awarded to the top 20 shooters on a four gun basis. All competitors are eligible for this award.
- Postal Matches: Postal Team pins will be awarded to the top 12 competitors in each match. The top 10 will be the Texas team with one coach and one team captain. **Competitors must be Texas residents to receive this award.**
- Special Award: A special award will be given for the top Ram count in each pistol classification.
- Pins: In-a-row pins will be awarded on the following basis:
 Master Class- All 15 pins, 10 turkey and 10 ram.
 AAA Class – All 15 pins, all 10 pins.
 AA Class – All 15 pins, all 10 pins, 5 turkey and 5 ram pins.
 A & B Class – All pins.
- Lodging, Camping: Limited camping is available at the ARC range with water and 30 Amp electrical connections. We do not have holding tank dumping facilities. Please let me know if you would like to camp on the range so that I may assure accommodations. Cost is \$15/day.
- Facilities: The Austin Rifle Club range faces North. The firing line is a concrete slab with a continuous cover over all positions. The targets will be white with dark brown earth berm backstops directly behind each target. Each target will have six positions with three sets of five targets. Each competitor will start at the bottom row moving up after each bank. The Austin Rifle Club requires all non-member competitors and visitors complete and submit a waiver and to wear a wrist band **or competitor badge** somewhere on their person while on the property. Any non-member on the range will be asked to comply or leave the property immediately.
- Weather: It will likely be warm and humid and or rainy. Bring shade canopies and lawn chairs. There will be an area behind the firing line for setting up your covers.
- Food / Water at Range: Lunches will be provided on Saturday and Sunday. Sandwich makings, chips, water or soda and some cookies. Competitors are requested to take advantage of the on-site meal to help facilitate an on-time start of the afternoon match.

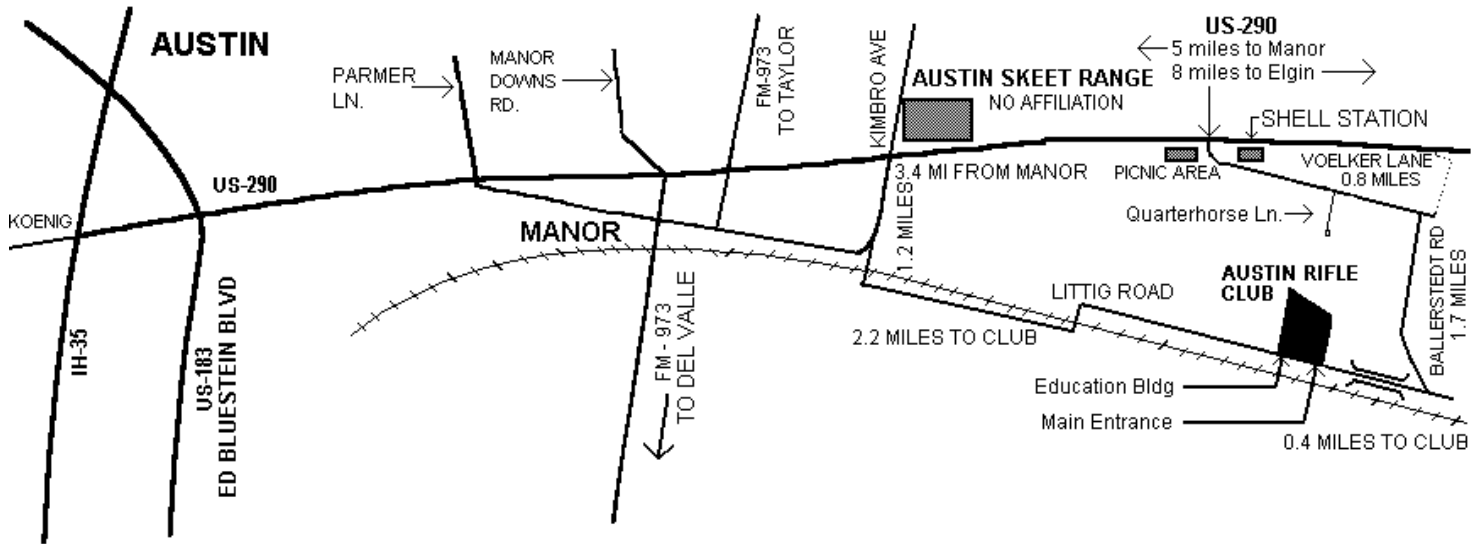

AUSTIN RIFLE CLUB – RANGE MAP

DIRECTIONS FROM AUSTIN: ALL RIGHT TURNS – BEST ROAD CONDITION

From the traffic light in Manor go approx. 5 miles and turn right onto **VOELKER LANE**. Voelker is between the State Picnic area and the Shell station. Go down Voelker approx. 0.8 miles and turn right onto **BALLERSTEDT RD**. Ballerstedt dead-ends at a stop sign at **LITTIG RD**. Turn right onto Littig and go about 0.4 mile to the AUSTIN RIFLE CLUB RANGE. It is the first driveway you can turn right. The gate to the Education Building is the second driveway you can turn right, about 1000 feet farther uphill.

ALTERNATE ROUTE: Go east 3.4 miles from Manor and turn right onto Kimbro Avenue. Where Kimbro curves to the right take Littig Rd. to the left and cross the railroad tracks. Follow the tracks east on Littig for 2.4 miles (you will cross the tracks again) to the Club.

The gate is open during scheduled activities such as matches, classes, and Orientation. (Most Sundays and some Saturdays). At other times the gate should remain locked. The range is closed to ALL shooting from 8:00 AM to NOON on the **THIRD SATURDAY** of each month for maintenance. You are encouraged to come out and put some sweat equity into the club. Bring work gloves, weed eater, and/or tools. We mow, clean up, re-build target frames, and often we have special projects. Check the club calendar in the newsletter or at www.austinrifclub.org for exceptions.

There are restrooms, but no vending machines, no store, no water fountain, or other services. We suggest that you bring something to drink, especially in hot weather. **EYE AND EAR PROTECTION IS MANDATORY.**

THE RANGE IS IN A FLOOD PLAIN and ACCESS MAY BE BLOCKED BY HEAVY RAINS AND FLOODING. Do not enter the range if there has been heavy rain, especially in Pflugerville or Manor. Bring rubber boots in wet weather. The range can get muddy.
